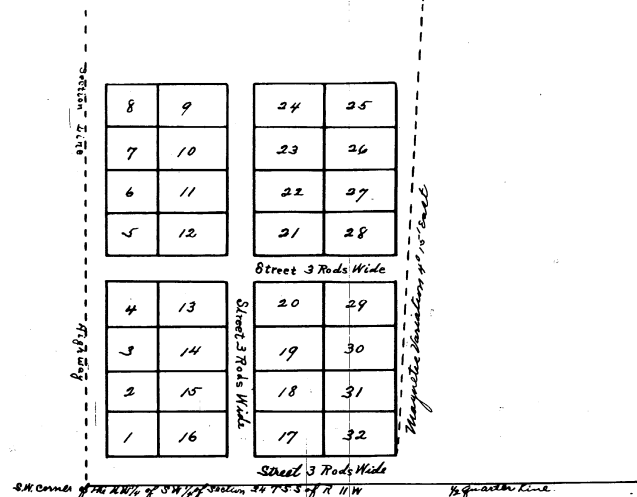


Keeneys addition to the Village of Parkville

I know all men by these presents that I Harry Keene of the township of Park County of St. Joseph and State of Michigan the proprietor of within plat of Keeneys addition to the Village of Parkville do hereby give and grant all the street and alley laid out in the said Village to the public for the use of the public for the Public Highways agreeable to the Statute in such case made and provided. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six
